From the Editor's Desk

The Ursuline Retreat Center in Kingston, Jamaica, is being run by the Ursuline sisters. It is open to Christians of all denominations. In addition, the facilities are used for workshops, training programmes, cursillos, marriage preparation and other activities related to spirituality or education. There is a small chapel, and the Ursuline community prays the Liturgy of the Hours in the mornings and evenings.

While on a recent visit, I met with **Sr. Mary Bernard Albertsen**, the current Prioress, **Sr. Valerie Ngui**, and **Sr. Marie Therese Gomes**. **Sr. Sheila George** and **Sr. Claudiet Jones** from Guyana are also stationed there. The Center accommodates 34 people, and the Sisters are in need of plastic, twin size mattress covers for the beds.



Sr. Marie Therese conducts the Sewing classes, in its fifth year since inception. Through an earlier appeal, she had received sewing patterns, but these have become "worn out", and she would be grateful to receive patterns in the larger sizes. She is also running a Breakfast Club, consisting of bread and butter with tea, served to elderly, homeless men and women. This is a project worthy of our consideration for monetary contributions.

The Convent houses a small library, used by children from impoverished homes in the community. There is a need for story books for ages four to fifteen, but mainly beginner reading level. I have been in touch with Pixie Gomes who was sorting the many boxes of books received from alumni for St. Rose's, and she has set aside three boxes for this purpose. I am looking for a way to get these boxes to the nuns in Kingston.

The Sisters charge a very low fee to use the Retreat Center, and I found out that this can barely meet their living expenses, so if you can help with any of these requests, please contact me.

REMEMBERING ANDY (LAM) LEE

Alumnus Andy Lee (née Lam) passed away on Sunday, March 20, 2005, in England after a long illness. She is survived by her two sons, Davin and Chad. Her husband, Robin Lee, had died in a tragic incident in the Bahamas in 1994.

Andy was one of the founding members of the Alumni Chapter in London, England,

In 1992, she undertook a mission to search for her ancestral roots and later collaborated with Trevor Sue-a-Quan, who was working on his first book, "Cane Reapers", to find and clarify the ancestries of the Chinese of Guyana. Trevor has credited Andy with "speaking to many Chinese Guyanese, particularly of the older generation, searching various archives in London, Cambridge and Oxford" that provided him with useful material for this book.

Andy went to Guyana to see what archival material could be found to further clarify the family histories. In an effort to continue her ancestral search, she later visited and worked in China and, according to Trevor, wrote "detailed accounts of her encounters with the natives and their usual routines and quirks, especially in relation to food, accommodation and facilities (or lack thereof). The various accounts that she wrote about her observations of today's fast-changing China are filled with insight, concern, resignation, delight and humor about China and her people."

Our deepest sympathies are extended to Andy's family and close friends. It is fitting that Trevor has compiled a short story about her experiences in China which he plans to use in the last chapter of a future book about Chinese Guyanese as immigrants in other countries.



We are sure you knew, the Guyanese diaspora rose to the occasion and there were many worthwhile groups that were quickly formed to raise funds and provide assistance. We chose to support the Alicea Foundation on behalf of St. Rose's, Toronto Chapter.

Our contributions were as follows:-

- \$1,000.00 cash
- 300.00 cash
- 500.00 cash from Australia (the Martin family & friends).
- 48 tubes antibiotic cream shipped
- 48 bottles calamine lotion shipped
- 1 Jumbo barrel of clothes shipped

Secretary, Maureen Webb, was in Guyana on personal business in February and visited St. Rose’s to determine how much flood damage was experienced. We were relieved to learn that there was no significant damage to the premises.
